CLASS OF 2008
LOCAL SCHOLARSHIPS

The following is a list of scholarships available from various organizations and people in the community. The amounts of the scholarships may vary depending on availability of funds so amounts listed may not be exact.

ALMA SCOTS HONOR SCHOLARSHIP

ONE \$4,000 SCHOLARSHIP FOR FRESHMAN YEAR

CRITERIA - Any senior planning to attend Alma College in Alma, Michigan and who demonstrates potential, interest and determination. Applicant must be admitted for the Fall of 2008. Applicant may be interested in any career field. In addition to the application form, each applicant is required to submit a letter that includes school and community activities, future plans and goals, and any relevant family history. A copy of your high school transcript will be attached before submission to the selection committee.

DEBRA BOUCHARD MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

ONE \$1,500 SCHOLARSHIP

CRITERIA – Any graduating senior with special needs who wishes to attend college, university, technical school, or vocational camp. Financial need is necessary to qualify for the scholarship and will be a major determining factor in the selection. High academic qualifications are not necessary.

BUILDING TRADES SCHOLARSHIP

TWO \$500 SCHOLARSHIPS

CRITERIA - Any senior who is a current or past building trades student and plans to pursue a career in a construction-related field, including an apprenticeship program. The student should have demonstrated ability and performance in the Building Trades Program and other related coursework. A special application is necessary and can be obtained in the guidance office or on-line. This special application is the ONLY application that is required for this scholarship.

KAY BURR SCHOLARSHIP

TWO \$1,000 to \$2,000 SCHOLARSHIPS

CRITERIA - Any senior who is either from a single parent family or a family where both parents have not attended a post secondary education. In addition, the family income level cannot exceed the mean standard of living for the greater Ann Arbor area (approximately \$35,000).

CLASS OF 2004 SCHOLARSHIP

ONE or TWO \$500 to \$1,000 SCHOLARSHIPS

CRITERIA – Any senior who plans to continue their education at an institution of higher learning who demonstrated commitment and service to their class.

COACH CRABTREE SCHOLARSHIP

ONE \$5,000 SCHOLARSHIP

CRITERIA – Any senior who has been awarded a Varsity Letter in any sport. The scholarship will be awarded to a student who exhibits a “commitment” to both athletics and academics which is evidenced by year round exemplary character, integrity and loyalty to the program. There is no specific grade criteria but there must be evidence of a “commitment” to academics. A copy of your high school transcript will be attached to your application before it is submitted to the selection committee.

EDUCATIONAL SUPPORT PERSONNEL-ORRIN CORL/SANDY ROGERS SCHOLARSHIP

NUMBER AND AMOUNT VARIES

CRITERIA - Any senior who plans to further his/her education at a technical school, two year community college, or four year college. Financial need is a primary consideration with sons/daughters of Educational Support Personnel given first preference.

HELEN GROSS MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

NUMBER and AMOUNT VARIES.

CRITERIA – Any senior who plans to attend a two or four year college or university, career technical school or business college. High academic qualifications are not necessary.

KAREN CRIMMINS HERRON MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

TWO \$500 SCHOLARSHIPS

CRITERIA – Any graduating senior who has maintained a B+ or better grade point average and plans on attending a four year college or university. One scholarship will go to a person planning on going into an engineering or physical science field; and another will go to a person planning on going into a medical or natural science related field.

TIM KIRALY SCHOLARSHIP

ONE \$1,000 SCHOLARSHIP

CRITERIA-Any senior planning to attend a two or four year college who possesses the qualities that Tim Kiraly, a former Saline Middle School technology teacher, possessed: keen interest in education, fascination with technology, concern for young people and a joy of life.

LEADERSHIP SCHOLARSHIP

TWO \$500 SCHOLARSHIPS

CRITERIA – Any senior who exhibits leadership at Saline High School through integrity, responsibility and dedication.

LILLIAN W. McCLELLAND MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

ONE APPROXIMATELY \$1,000 SCHOLARSHIP

CRITERIA – Any senior who plans to attend a two year or four year college with the expressed intention to major in a foreign language in college, with preference given to Spanish or French; or expressed interest in earning a Baccalaureate Degree in Secondary Education. Personal character, financial need, and high school scholastic achievement will also be taken into consideration. In addition to the application form, a letter shall be submitted, including a short biography, future plans, and choice of institution, major area of interest, family description, and financial need.

FORMER MISS SALINE ASSOCIATION SCHOLARSHIP

THREE SCHOLARSHIPS: Miss Saline \$800 – 1st Runner-Up \$550 – 2nd Runner-Up \$450

CRITERIA - Any female student between the ages of 16 and 21 years of age who reside in the Saline Area School District and are participants in the Miss Saline Pageant. Applications for the pageant are available July 15th from the Saline Reporter Office and due August 15th.

DOUGLAS J. MULL TRADE SCHOOL SCHOLARSHIP

NUMBER OF \$500 SCHOLARSHIPS WILL VARY

CRITERIA - Graduating Seniors from the South and West Washtenaw Consortium classes who elect to pursue a Trade or Vocational School and/or a vocational program at a community college in lieu of a major college or university. In addition to this application, each applicant must submit a one-page letter describing their future goals and aspirations regarding their trade or vocational training and the genuine circumstances surrounding the reason for entering that particular field of vocational study.

PAUL J. PETERS MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

ONE \$1,000 to \$2,000 SCHOLARSHIP

CRITERIA – Any senior who has maintained a “B+” (3.333) or better grade point average planning to enroll in a 2 to 4 year course of study in engineering, physics, architecture, construction, aeronautics or related field. If more than one candidate is judged to be qualified for this scholarship, financial need may be considered in choosing the recipient.

PING'S SCHOLAR ATHLETE AWARD

TWO \$1,000 SCHOLARSHIPS

CRITERIA - Any senior who has maintained a 2.80 grade point average on a 4.00 scale. Preference will be given to a student athlete who has lettered in the highest number of sports. If all candidates are judged equally in sports participation and grade point average, outside interests, such as student government, will be the determining factor. A special application is necessary in addition to the local scholarship application and can be obtained in the guidance office or on-line.

EDWARD REDIES FOUNDATION/ELMER HOUGHTON SCHOLARSHIP

MULTIPLE \$1,000 to \$2,500 SCHOLARSHIPS

CRITERIA - Any senior who plans to attend a four year college or two year community college within the state of Michigan. Donors are interested in helping students who have to finance their own education.

SALINE ALUMNI ASSOCIATION SCHOLARSHIP

ONE \$1,000 SCHOLARSHIP

CRITERIA - Any senior who is in the top 25% of the class and who plans to attend a four year college or a two year community college. Daughters or sons of a Saline High School graduate are given preference.

SALINE AMERICAN LEGION, AUXILIARY & SONS OF AMERICAN LEGION SCHOLARSHIPS: NUMBER and AMOUNT of SCHOLARSHIPS VARY

CRITERIA - Any senior who plans to attend a two or four year college or university, career technical school or business college. High academic qualifications are not necessary.

SALINE AREA SENIOR CENTER SCHOLARSHIP

NUMBER AND AMOUNT VARIES

CRITERIA – Any graduating senior who has volunteered in assisting senior citizens during the student's Middle or High School years; and/or has worked for pay for a business or non-profit organization which deals directly with senior citizens. In addition to the application, each applicant is required to submit a short essay describing the impact of working with senior citizens has had on their life and how they plan to continue to work with senior citizens in the future.

SALINE COMMUNITY HOSPITAL AUXILIARY SCHOLARSHIP

THREE \$1,000 SCHOLARSHIPS

CRITERIA – 1) Two scholarships are for students intending to enroll in a four-year program in nursing or other health care field. They must be in the top 25% of the graduating class. One of these is in honor of William Lavery, former CEO of Saline Community Hospital. 2) Another scholarship is for a student intending to enroll in a one or two year Community College program in a nursing or other health care field.

SALINE EDUCATION ASSOCIATION: MAXINE ROSS/HOWARD MCCANN SCHOLARSHIP

THREE or FOUR APPROXIMATELY \$1,000 SCHOLARSHIPS

CRITERIA - Any senior who plans to pursue a career in the education field.

SALINE HARVEST OF THE ARTS SCHOLARSHIP

ONE \$200 SCHOLARSHIP

CRITERIA – Graduating seniors from Saline High School with and expressed intent to study Culinary Arts in a post-secondary educational setting with a minimum 3.0 grade point average or minimum 22 composite score on the ACT. Personal character and financial need will also be considered. In addition to the application, each applicant must submit a letter that includes a short biography, future plans, choice of institution, major areas of interest an description of financial need

SALINE HIGH SCHOOL HORTICULTURE AWARD

A MINIMUM OF ONE \$1,000 AWARD

CRITERIA – Any senior who can demonstrate a love of, or interest in, plants of any kind. Two awards will be given: 1) one to a student who can demonstrate how they have grown or nurtured plants; agricultural or decorative; and 2) one to a student who can express their love of horticulture through artistic means, such as writing, painting, photographs, or other visual arts. Whether the applicant is going on to future education, or not, is irrelevant. The award is for present achievement. In order to show how they qualify, applicants are encouraged to show evidence of their interest with their application. A special application is necessary and can be obtained in the guidance office or on-line. This special application is required in addition to the local scholarship for this award.

SALINE KIWANIS CLUB SCHOLARSHIP

TWO \$1,000 SCHOLARSHIPS

CRITERIA - Any senior needing financial aid to attend a two or four year college. High academic qualifications are not necessary.

SALINE LIONS CLUB SCHOLARSHIP

TWO \$1,000 SCHOLARSHIPS

CRITERIA - Any senior interested in optometry, medicine, fields of the future, special education, or physical therapy. Candidates must be in the upper 50% of the class.

SALINE ROTARY CLUB SCHOLARSHIPS

THREE SCHOLARSHIPS, ONE IN EACH OF THE FOLLOWING CATEGORIES:

- *ACADEMIC SCHOLARSHIP*

ONE \$1,000 SCHOLARSHIP

CRITERIA - Any senior who is in the top 25% of the class and who plans to attend a four year college, two year community college, or trade or business school.

- *CAREER-TECHNICAL SCHOLARSHIP*

ONE \$1,000 SCHOLARSHIP

CRITERIA - Any senior who plans to attend a career technical (vocational) institution, a two year community college or any other post-secondary institution granting a two-year or associate degree.

- *ALWIN GROSS/HOWARD JOHNSON SCHOLARSHIP*

ONE \$1,000 SCHOLARSHIP

CRITERIA - Any senior who is interested in the field of agri-business and plans to enroll in a two or four year college. If there are no qualified candidates, the scholarship may be given to a previous recipient.

JEREMY TARLEA SCHOLARSHIP

ONE \$500 SCHOLARSHIP

CRITERIA-Any senior planning to attend a two or four year college or university with the intent to study Special Education.

THE THOMAS L. THOMAS FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP

ONE \$2,000 SCHOLARSHIP

CRITERIA-Any senior who has maintained a 3.5 or higher grade point average and who plans to attend a 4 year college or university majoring in engineering, science or technology related field. If more than one candidate is qualified for this scholarship, financial need may be considered. In addition to the application, each applicant is required to submit a letter that includes school and community activities, future plans and goals, and any relevant family history. A copy of your high school transcript will be attached to your application before submitted to the selection committee.

RACHAEL TOWNSEND MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

ONE \$500 SCHOLARSHIP

CRITERIA – Any female student athlete planning to attend a two or four year college or university.

UNITED METHODIST CHURCH OF SALINE CARR MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

ONE or TWO \$100 to \$200 SCHOLARSHIPS

CRITERIA - A United Methodist Church member with passing grades and showing a need.
Applicants must apply at the church.

UNTERKIRCHER SCHOLARSHIP

ONE APPROXIMATELY \$1,000 SCHOLARSHIP (varies from year to year)

CRITERIA - Any senior who has good character, financial need, and in the top 1% of the class.

WASHTENAW ASSOCIATION OF RETIRED SCHOOL PERSONNEL SCHOLARSHIP

ONE \$500 SCHOLARSHIP TO BE APPLIED TO TUITION AND BOOKS-renewable

CRITERIA - Any senior who plans to attend Washtenaw Community College and who demonstrates potential, need, interest and determination. Applicant does not have to be interested in an educational career field.

WASHTENAW COMMUNITY COLLEGE PRESIDENT'S HONOR SCHOLARSHIP

FIVE FULL TUITION SCHOLARSHIPS FOR ONE YEAR PLUS \$300 FOR BOOKS EACH SEMESTER.

CRITERIA - Any senior with a 3.20 grade point average (4.0 scale) who plans to attend Washtenaw Community College. Scholarship can be renewed for a second year if a 3.00 grade point average is maintained at Washtenaw Community College. A special application is necessary and can be obtained in the guidance office or at the Washtenaw Community College web site at www.wccnet.edu. This special application is the only application that is required for this scholarship. A copy of your high school transcript will be attached to your application before given to the selection committee.

AND/OR

WASHTENAW COMMUNITY COLLEGE PROCASSINI HONOR SCHOLARSHIP

ONE FULL TUITION SCHOLARSHIP FOR ONE YEAR PLUS \$300 FOR BOOKS AND SUPPLIES

CRITERIA - Any senior who plans to attend Washtenaw Community College. A special application is necessary and can be obtained in the guidance office or on-line at the Washtenaw Community College web site at www.wccnet.edu. This special application is the only application that is required for this scholarship.

- Please note that only one scholarship form is to be used for either of the Washtenaw Community College Scholarships or may be used if applying for both. The other local scholarship form used is not necessary for the Washtenaw Community College scholarships.
- Please also note that these applications are due with the other local scholarship applications and NOT the date noted on the Washtenaw Community College Honor Scholarship form.
